



2017 Annual General Meeting & Conference

Join SaskBooks for our annual conference, **June 15 and 16 in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan**. Conference sessions begin at noon in the stately Delta Bessborough Hotel on Thursday, 15 June with Industry Updates while we nosh, followed by presentations and discussions with **Arthur Slade** on social marketing, and **Luanne Schlosser** on slander, libel, and defamation law for publishers. You'll want to register early to confirm your spot for a riverboat **dinner cruise** and social on the Prairie Lily Riverboat. Floating dignitaries and sailing always make for great conversation!

Friday, 16 June we change the venue to the historic Wanuskewin Heritage Park, for sessions on marketing with **Zoe Grams** of **ZG Communications** of Vancouver. We'll share a hearty lunch and wrap up our afternoon session with a publishers' **Dream Big Roundtable** discussion about their challenges and successes, their wishes and fears, and what they would do if they had the capacity to do it.

Take advantage of the **early registration discount** - only \$75 per person from publishing houses with memberships in SaskBooks or any of our sister affiliates (ABPBC, AMBP, BPAA) until 1 June 2017. Regular registration fees are \$100 per person for members and affiliate members. Not a member of a provincial publishing association? That's okay! Early registration for non-members is \$125 until 1 June 2017 and Regular registration (2 - 12 June) is \$150 for non-members. Your registration fees include two lunches, a breakfast, and did we mention the dinner cruise on a riverboat?

Registration will remain open until **Monday, 12 June** at 5:00pm.

If you are a member of SaskBooks or any of our sister affiliates (ABPBC, AMBP, BPAA), are located at least 100km from Saskatoon, and are registered for the annual conference, you may apply for a travel subsidy of up to \$100 for an individual (maximum 1 per firm) or a \$200 travel subsidy for 2 or more attendees from your firm. There are a limited number of travel subsidies available and they will be assigned in order of receipt of paid registration. You must provide copies of travel expenses and a completed travel expense claim form (available at the conference) before cheques will be issued. Expenses claimed after 30 June 2017 or for travel expenses outside of the conference dates are not eligible.
